[4] DCG requirements may be met with double-count major courses.

[5] Credit earned for math support course does not count toward unit requirements for graduation, GE or major.

[6] Course double-counts for GE and major requirement

[7] Select major concentration courses in consultation with your major advisor.

[8] Take either AIE 330 OR CD 310, not both. For students wishing to complete the American Indian Education Minor, be sure to take AIE 330

[9] Take either AIE 335 OR CD 467(S), not both. For students wishing to complete the American Indian Education Minor, be sure to take AIE 335.

[10] Take seven additional units to meet 120 units required for a Bachelor's degree.

[11] Students interested in a psychology emphasis are advised to take PSYC 104 to fulfill one of their lower division Area D GE Requirements.

[12] CD 209 double counts for lower division Area E GE and major requirement. If you take CD 209, select an elective course.

Do not take a course solely to meet UD GE Area D requirements. Area D is covered by the major.

Do not take a course solely to meet Diversity and Common Ground Standards.
